Fall and winter at Sitka are seasons of creation and connection.

In October, we gather to celebrate the 30th annual Art Invitational. This event features new works from 100 regional artists who invite us to reflect on our evolving relationship with nature. Our fall keynote will take place

at the Invitational, where artists **Marie Watt and Julia D'Amario** will share insights into their collaboration.

From October to April, over 50 practitioners across the arts and natural sciences will find inspiration in residence at Sitka, drawing from the coastal landscape and each other. **Sitka Music Fellow Licity Collins** will curate a collaborative residency for music-based artists to culminate the 2024-2025 season.

This fall also brings over **100 thought-provoking titles** to our art and ecology reference library, curated by **Sitka Literary Arts Fellow Adam Swanson**. Join us on October 3 for readings by authors featured in the collection and to explore these books in person.

Beyond our campus, **Sitka's K-8 Create program** will expand to serve 5,000 youth, partnering with schools to address arts education access gaps across three coastal counties and serve as a regional model for rural communities statewide.

Looking ahead, I am excited to announce that **US Poet Laureate Ada Limón** will be our spring keynote speaker in May 2025. More details about the free, in-person readings we are planning together will be shared in the new year.

Whether you join us at the Invitational in Portland, visit our coastal campus, tune in for our online resident talk series or introduce new friends to Sitka, thank you for enriching our learning community throughout the seasons.
